Third year: Sociology orientation

Starting from academic year 2023-2024 there will be a minor curriculum change in the Sociology orientation. Transition measures

Starting from academic year 2023-2024 there will be a minor curriculum change in the Sociology orientation. More specifically, the mandatory course Generalized Linear Techniques (GLT) will be substituted by the elective course Multivariate Data Analysis (MDA). MDA will become a mandatory course, whereas Generalized Linear Techniques will be offered as an elective course. How does this modification affect your study path?

Students who started the Sociology orientation in 2022-2023 and have not graduated:

> Students who took GLT as part of their compulsory courses but did not pass the course, will be allowed to enroll again in GLT as part of their compulsory courses in 2023-2024. If you wish to enroll for MDA instead of GLT, contact your study path counsellor via studypath.es@vub.be before October 15.

Students who start in the Sociology orientation in 2023-2024:

> You will have MDA as a compulsory course. GLT will be available an elective course.

Students of the Political Science and Communication Studies orientations:

Nothing changes for you. Both courses, GLT and MDA, will continue to be offered as elective courses.



Second year

Two subjects of the second year will change semester starting in academic year 2023-2024 two subject will change semester. 'Critical Thinking in Political Sciences' will become a 2nd semester course, whereas 'Qualitative Research Methods' will become a 1st semester course.
