

BULDING BLOCKS OF EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES



Studies or Traineeship

- Always <u>during</u> & <u>part</u> of your VUB studies, never after graduation (excl. Erasmus+ Traineeship after graduation)
- English or local language? Make sure to check

Studies: course package at VUB is substituted by course package at partner institution

- You take courses and exams abroad
- Obtained credits abroad are recognised at VUB
- Grade conversion by Faculty (not always a 1:1 conversion)
- Destination depending on existing agreements

Traineeship: as part of your VUB programme that contains an internship (ECTS)

host organisation selected by student and approved by exchange coordinator







ERASMUS+ KA1 GRANTS



Studies: €369 - €419/month

- + €250/month top up for students belonging to the category of fewer opportunities
- + travel cost depending on distance (see table)

Traineeships: €519 - €569/month

- 1 + €250/month top up for students belonging to the category of fewer opportunities
- + travel cost depending on distance (see table)




ERASMUS+ KA1 GRANTS



- Limited funding available: ranking by faculty based on faculty criteria
- If you receive an Erasmus+ grant → Max. funding of 6 months
 - With exception of students belonging to the fewer opportunities category

Exc. Traineeship after graduation (apply externally, first-come-first served)





ERASMUS+ KA1 – GRANT TOP-UPS

GREEN TRAVEL

- If you travel in environmentally friendly way (e.g. train, bus, car poling)
- 1 Check greenerasmus.org for tips to make your mobility more sustainable



PARTICIPANTS WITH FEWER OPPORTUNITIES

- = Students with
- Flemish study allowance (Vlaamse Studietoelage)
- Almost Flemish study allowance (Bijna-Beursstudenten)
- Disability recognised by VAPH (=Vlaams Agentschap Voor Personen met een Handicap)
- Working student : very specific conditions, different definition from VUB working student

INCLUSION SUPPORT

- Extra inclusion support for students with disabilities
- VUB can support pre visits to the student mobility destination upon request (case-by-case)



ERASMUS+ TRAINEESHIP AFTER GRADUATION

- Traineeship After studies
- To apply before graduation
- Within 1 year after graduation
- "First Come, First served" principle for grant
- Traineeship in line with VUB diploma
- Nomination faculty needed



EXCHANGE GRANT (BUITENLANDTOELAGE)

- Managed by the study finance department
- Several conditions
 - Only for exchanges in which you complete part of your study curriculum.
 - Calculated on the basis of the number of months abroad
 - I Family indexed cadastral income may not exceed € 1.250
 - Not combinable with rent allowance
 - Nationality or residency requirements
 - Grant amount variable Up to € 270/month
- Apply before departure





- Once nominated by your faculty towards IRMO, IRMO will inform you via email on specific deadlines



- In which programs can you go on exchange?
 - o Business Economics
 - o TEW
 - o Handelsingenieur
 - o International Business
 - o Business & Technology
- You cannot go on exchange during the Master Management or Master Bedrijfskunde

- When can you go on exchange?
 - o Exchange during 3rd Bachelor
 - 1st and/or 2nd semester
 - Exchange during 1st or 2nd Master
 - 1st and/or 2nd semester
- Scholarship for 1 semester only!



Conditions to go on exchange

General rules:

- Bachelor: Pass all courses of bachelor 1 and bachelor 2 and/or the courses you are currently enrolled for.
- Master: passed all courses of bridging, preparatory or bachelor program after June or September exam session and all courses you are enrolled for.
- If you are in an **individual program** the general rule is that you would need to have passed for all of your registered courses in the current academic year and for all 1st bachelor courses

• Exam specific rules:

To get **nominated**: everyone can submit nomination dossier **unless** you already have 2 failed exams <u>OR</u> were (illegitimately) absent for 1 exam during the January Exam session

Easier said than done but try to pass for <u>all</u> your courses in the 1st exam session!

!! If you have more than 2 failed exams or were (illegitimately) absent for 1 exam during the January Exam session, you cannot submit a nomination dossier.



How can I apply for exchange? EU destinations

- submit <u>nomination dossier</u> by February 15, 2026
 - Pick 3 destinations in order of preference
 - Include a draft of possible courses to take at your most preferred destination
 - Send to mobility.es@vub.be by February 15, 2026
- We do not require a transcript of records but your grades will be important when we rank to allocate destinations and scholarship funds!

How can I apply for exchange? NON-FU destinations

- Submit <u>nomination dossier</u> by <u>December 1, 2025</u>
 - Include a draft of possible courses to take at your preferred destination
 - Complete the non-EU nomination forms by December 1, 2025
 - A re-evaluation of your nomination will be made after the January exam session
- Submit separate dossier for EU backup destination by February 15, 2026
- We do not require a transcript of records but your grades will be important when we rank to allocate destinations and scholarship funds!

Post-exam evaluations



JANUARY

Check whether you meet the exchange criteria after the Janaury exam session

- Do you meet the criteria?
 Great, you can submit a nomination dossier!
- You don't meet the criteria? Unfortunately, you cannot apply for an exchange.



FEBRUARY

- Submit your EU nomination dossier before Feburary 15th
- The Faculty will evaluate your nomination dossier and inform you by mid March.



JUNE

After the exam period your nomination will be re-evaluated

- If you don't meet the criteria, your exchange will be cancelled
- If you passed all your exams, you'll be given green light for exchange
- If you meet the criteria, but have retakes, your nomination will be put on hold



SEPTEMBER

After the retake exams, your nomination will be re-evaluated

- If you don't meet the criteria, your exchange will be cancelled
- If you meet the criteria, you'll receive green light for exchange

NON-EU EXCHANGE

If you applied for non-EU exchange, your nomination will aso be re-evaluated in January to see if you meet the criteria
